The American Kennel Club is excited to announce the launch of its new Achiever Dog certificate program. The AKC Achiever Dog certificate program is designed to recognize those exhibitors and dogs who participate in multiple sports. A dog will receive an AKC Achiever Dog certificate when they have been awarded a placement or earned a qualifying score in three different sports. Dogs can start earning AKC Achiever Dog certificates December 1, 2017.

"Many exhibitors are interested in participating in different sports," said Dr. Carmen Battaglia, AKC Board Member. "The AKC Achiever Dog program is designed to encourage owners to try a variety of sports, finding those they enjoy and realizing success. Both are winners!" AKC is launching the Achiever Dog as a pilot program. At the end of one year, all owners who have received a certificate will be surveyed to determine the success of the program. Opportunities for improvement will be identified and could lead to a more refined program which recognizes these versatile dogs. This award will be presented semi-annually.

All submissions are due July 1st and December 1st of each calendar year. A committee of AKC employees will vote on the winner using the following criteria: eligibility of club per requirements and evidence of active Public Education outreach. A club is only eligible to win this award every two years.

A DISCOVERY IN MY KITCHEN Sandy Crawford

I give my Westies a teaspoon of pumpkin most days to keep their stools tight, adds bulk to their food to help keep their weight down, and pumpkin is a great source of antioxidants and other nutrients that benefits all dogs. They like the taste and it causes no harm. I fed organic pumpkin and that is the only ingredient. I found organic pumpkin at Wal-Mart for \$1.88 a can which is very responsible compared to several area grocery stores. When I opened a can I always had too much left over even after several days of use. So, I grabbed one of those oldfashioned individual ice cube trays and spooned the canned pumpkin into each individual section until it was level full. After freezing, I dumped the dozen chunks into plastic bags and stored in the freezer taking only a couple out at a time to defrost in the refrigerator. No more wasted or spoiled pumpkin! It works great and you can also zap a cube or two in the microwave on the defrost setting if more is needed.
