


#### TO BE A GOOD STUDENT:

Some ideas to be a Good Dog Training Student at your next Seminar:

- 1.) Do not worry about making mistakes. By making the mistake in front of the clinician they will see why you and your dog are having problems in a specific area. Go to the next seminar with an open mind and to learn everything available to you.
- 2.) Be a good listener at the seminar. Listen take notes to maximize the most learning. It takes hearing something many times to have really heard and understand to concept.
- 3.) Listen to your clinician's input and accept it with gratitude and grace. Try not to make excuses. Every training concept is a tool in your tool box and may not be needed now but could be needed in the future. Listen to criticism but don't get defensive. This will lead to growth in your knowledge.
- 4.) When working at a seminar, be sure to ask for clarification if you are confused. You may even want to reread your notes overnight and then ask for clarification during the next session. Your request for clarification will benefit you and will give your clinician feedback on how they presented the concept.
- 5.) Take responsibility for the dog's mistake. You are the leader and have been reinforcing the dog's behaviors. Timing of those reinforcers are very crucial. Recently, the use of a marker word is a way to tell your dog that they are correct and pay (treats) will soon come. Sometimes our positive reinforcement is done at the wrong time approving the wrong behavior. You must become a master of controlling what reinforces the dog's behavior. You dog is a reflection of our abilities as trainers.
- 6.) You should always be growing at a trainer and trying to step outside of your comfort zone. Always be learning.
- 7.) Take a moment to figure out where you are now in your dog training and set goals for 1 month, 6 months and 1 year. Keeping a Training Journal will help you to always have a training plan. Know that that plan may have to be adjusted on the fly. Our dogs have good and bad days too.

8.) Watching others at a show or match can help you with your visualization. You should be able to see your dog and you enter the ring and go through your level you are showing at. You can also learn by volunteering at a show or match. "Teaching is the highest form of understanding." - Aristotle



- Allow your human to tether themselves to you.
   This keeps them from wandering off or running away.
- Your human will probably need breaks. Be considerate and stop and sniff often.
- 3. Bark frequently. Human have short attention spans.
- When you go to the bathroom, walk away. If you have trained your human correctly, they will pick it up. It is good aerobics.
- Periodically drag your human as fast as you can. This is called *Interval Training*.
- Do not allow your human shorten the walk. They are being lazy. Sit in protest if you must.
- Once you return home, allow your human to remove their tether, then lick their face many times This is positive reinforcement for a job well done.
